Addressing Individual Life Success & Economic Development Needs - Season to Season

Our project's goal is to reduce local poverty by helping individuals find employment by supplying the basic economic tools of success such as interview clothing and job search mentoring to help them find sustainable work and to fit into the culture of their new positions.

Each hour while tasks are completed, team members will be asked to consider **WHY:**

- 1) When impoverished members of the community are finally able to reach their life goals and dreams of success, the result is the entire community benefits and takes a positive step forward.
- 2) When we are generally concerned about the well-being of those who have the least among us - We all experience peace.
- 3) By supplying those least among us with the essential tools of success, namely: interview clothing, interview training, encouragement and mentoring; people who are struggling with economic hardship are empowered to become successful citizens and independent under their own power, proving Dr. King's proposition that "Everybody can be great, because everyone can serve."
